<i>History of London</i>	This workshop brings 2,000 years of history to life using drama and conversation activities. It explores important historical figures and events of London. In addition, students learn how to use a timeline.	90 min.	x	x	
new <i>Welcome to New York City</i>	In this workshop, students learn about the history of New York City as a capital of culture and business, from its beginnings through its immigrant populations and up to the present day. The history and culture of this vibrant city comes alive through drama and conversation activities.	90 min.	x	x	
<i>Passport to English</i>	In this workshop, students get to know their tutor and the tutor's Anglophone culture through a series of activities including interviews, cultural presentations, and comparisons with Italian culture and traditions.	90 min.	x	x	
<i>Team-Building and Group Dynamics</i>	This workshop helps students develop teamwork and social skills. The emphasis is on boosting confidence and encouraging reflection on everyday human relationships. Students participate in a variety of activities that encourage them to speak with their peers and look at ways to support each other and cooperate at school and in life.	90 min.	x	x	x
<i>William Shakespeare: An Introduction</i>	This workshop introduces students to the life, times and characters of William Shakespeare. A short interactive presentation is followed by drama activities that encourage students to express themselves and become more familiar with Shakespeare's most popular characters and themes.	90 min.		x	x
<i>Let's Make a Movie!</i>	In this workshop, students collaborate with their peers to complete an action map and storyboard. They then use their ideas to write a script and make a short video. Note: This workshop requires students to use their smartphones/cameras.	90 min.		x	x
<i>The Hero's Journey</i>	This workshop explores the hero's journey through several examples, including The Odyssey, The Hunger Games, and Harry Potter. Students also learn to plot their own story according to the phases of the hero's journey. Note: The Hero's Journey refers to the structure of the narrative that tells about a hero's life.	90 min.		x	x
<i>Students Take Action!</i>	In this workshop, students look at problems (e.g. bullying, social media, road safety, and environmental, health, and educational issues) that affect them and their school. Students in groups then create a public service campaign to draw attention to the problems and suggest solutions.	90 min.		x	x
